



GENERAL INFORMATION

State Medicaid programs provide community-based services for individuals with disabilities who qualify for nursing facility services and prefer to continue living in their homes and communities.

These services do not offer 24-hour care but provide in-home support and assistance. The level of services is determined based on the specific needs of the disabled person.

Depending on your Medicaid program, you can choose between agency-based or self-directed services. Moreover, a trusted friend or family member can be paid to help you stay in your home.

If you have a disability and need help with daily activities or are considering placing yourself or a loved one in a group home, think about whether staying in the community might be the best option.

If you need assistance for yourself or a loved one and prefer to stay in the community, and you are receiving or eligible for Medicaid and DD waiver services in Arizona, New Mexico, or the Navajo Nation, there may be additional options available to you.

You may contact the Law Center if you require assistance with this process. A staff member will interview you to determine your eligibility for services and assess whether your legal issue falls within the Law Center's assistance scope.

The Law Center strives to arrange meetings at locations and times that are convenient for the clients at locations and times that are close to and convenient for the client.



AVAILABLE SERVICES

- Personal Care: Assistance with daily living activities, such as bathing, dressing, cooking, and shopping.
- Skilled Therapies: Occupational, Physical, Speech, and Language Therapy for adults 21 and older.
- Environmental Modifications: changes to your home to enhance safety and independence.
- Respite Care: Substitute provider to give the primary caregiver a break or in case of illness.
- Behavioral Health Services
- Transportation
- Translation services
